**Measures of quality control :  
bilingual competences  
(decision 2009-03)**

The foreign language in CLIL classes has to be a foreign language taught at the corresponding school (i.e. regional or minority languages as well as other national languages can only be used to verify bilingual competences if they are simultaneously taught at school).

CLIL classes have to comprise at least 70 hours within the last two years prior to the A-levels or 140 hours within the last four years prior to the A-levels.

Principally every subject can be taught bilingually as long as it is part of the school's curriculum and meets the school's quality standards.

In order to safeguard the quality of their bilingual courses the schools are advised to develop corresponding measures of quality control (assessment tests, feedback from competent colleagues who attend lessons/ tests ("critical friends")).

The partner countries exchange their experiences with the different subjects used for CLIL classes and may report on the issue on the next annual conference.
